Most working poor and low-income families in Marin County spend the majority of their income for rent and have little left for basic necessities such as clothing, food, healthcare, and edu-

cation. Many low-income families in Marin County participate in this program, and the need has tripled since 2003.

Children at Pilgrim Park and Ritter Center will be receiving these school supplies from our church. Your donations will help local children start school with the confidence that comes from being prepared with the necessary tools.

PILGRIM PARK NEWS

FLAG DAY 2014 was special for Pilgrim Park. After a multi-month effort, we raised the Stars and Stripes over Pilgrim Park.

Preparation: Last year the Board agreed that we needed a flagpole. That decision set in motion many steps and many folks, including Francisco Galindo, our jack of all trades maintenance expert who keeps the place running;



Nancy Smith, who oversees everything; Barbara Brown, our architect who is always willing to help; Margie Rollman; and Bob De Haan, who loves these kinds of projects. Barbara found a used, but bent flag pole in storage in Sausalito at a wooden boat shop and convinced the owner to donate it to us. Francisco then took charge of straightening the solid wooden, 30 foot pole, refinishing it to a gleaming gloss white, and erecting it. Nancy blessed the location and beamed as the project came together. Margie found the bronze eagle on the top and the other hardware. Bob, with the help of his stepson, designed the foundation (four feet down and full of concrete and steel) and helped Francisco arrange for a 65-pound stainless steel bracket to hold the pole upright and firmly on the foundation. In case of an earthquake, hug the pole; it's not going anywhere.

A side benefit of acquiring the pole triggered the interest of a *SF Chronicle* reporter to investigate Pilgrim Park and write the great article for the Marin supplement.

June 14 Flag Raising Event: Residents and some church members assembled to honor the veterans present who raised the flag. Veterans from the British Merchant Marine in WWII, the Korean War (army, the U. S. Air Force, the Navy and the South Korean Army) helped Rick Taylor, a resident and Vietnam veteran with three Purple Hearts, a Bronze Star and a special commendation for bravery, raise the flag while "Stars and Stripes Forever" played. The flag will fly 24/7 as two spot lights will illumine it at night. As we honored a South Korean veteran, the SF counsel general of South Korea sent his greetings in a framed statement and requested we fly his country's flag with Old Glory on the anniversary of the invasion by the North, which we did. This was a glorious event followed by a picnic lunch, featuring sausages grilled on our new barbecue.

OTHER PILGRIM PARK NEWS

Two New Decks: A contractor is putting the finishing touches on two new second story decks. The partial wall surrounding the decks was badly rotted. We have three more to do.

Pilgrim Park's Financial Condition: Our fiscal year ends on June 30. Although the annual audit will not be complete for several months, Bob De Haan reports that Pilgrim Park remains in excellent financial condition with adequate reserves. There were no significant deviations from budget last year. The Board recently adopted a conservative budget for next year that shows a positive cash flow and that anticipates more deck work and more sewer replacement.

Bob De Haan is at Pilgrim Park most Tuesday mornings. Please stop by for any questions you have or to just have some coffee and goodies in a cool place. The De Haan center is air conditioned.

Yes, when this flesh and heart shall fail, And mortal life shall cease; I shall possess, within the veil, A life of joy and peace.

"Our forefathers were not content to learn about their Christian religion from the scriptures and prayer books, or from long and often complicated sermons. They wanted to sing about it too. They wanted to express their simple joy at finding God's love by singing about it with a variety of sacred choruses, many of which they and learned as children." Here is the story behind one famous hymn.

"Amazing Grace" was written in 1779 by John Newton, a former slave ship captain whose experience in a near shipwreck caused his conversion to Christianity and his decision to become an abolitionist. Later, as an Anglican minister, he wrote this hymn about his transformative shipboard experience.


ion table on Sundays for the months of May, June and July! The Board of Ministry is are so grateful to them for sharing this opportunity to express creativity.




