The candy will be sold at a holiday events that are still in the planning process!



MOVIE NIGHT NOVEMBER 21 - IN A BETTER WORLD

This film from Danish director Susanne Bier (*After the Wedding*, *Brothers*) won both the Oscar and the Golden Globe for Best Foreign-Language picture of 2010.

Anton (Mikael Persbrandt) is a doctor who commutes between an idyllic suburban family life in Denmark and his volunteer work in a refugee camp in Africa. In one world he is trying to help his ten year-old son adjust to a new school. In the other, threats to the camp from a sadistic local "Big Man" make the horrors of civil war a daily reality. In navigating these two worlds, Anton (and we) are forced to re-examine our beliefs about revenge and forgiveness and our comfortable assumptions about what constitutes "civilized" behavior.



"How do we react to the presence of evil and injustice when, as an adult or a child, it intrudes on our world? It's easy enough to say "you fight it," but the reality is never that simple.

"Danish filmmaker Susanne Bier has a potent gift for turning abstract, moral questions like these into edge-of-your-seat compelling dramas that examine, with devastating effect, the complex web of feelings that make us who we are. Bier also knows how to gracefully enhance emotional connection without pushing too hard, how to ramp things up without losing control. The result is the kind of realistic, involving adult scenarios that Hollywood mostly only dreams about these days."


