

Thursday, March 29 Maundy Thursday

6:30 PM We will share a simple meal of soup and bread followed by a short meditative worship service that includes communion. Feel free to bring your favorite soup to share or a loaf of good bread.

Friday, March 30 Good Friday

12 noon - 3 PM: The sanctuary will be open and prepared for prayer and meditation. Taize songs will be playing softly – feel free to sing along if you wish.



There will be seven prayer stations to visit - each one focusing on one of the "last seven words of Jesus." ("The last seven words" is a traditional way of referring to seven phrases or quotes that are attributed to Jesus during his last hours of earthly life. They are drawn from all four gospels.) Each station will be set up to enhance your prayerful contemplation and meditation with sacred objects, artwork, poems, quotes, and written reflections.

Pastor Sally will be available during that time if you wish to speak with her. Otherwise it can be a time of quiet. Come when you can, leave when you must.

Sunday, April 1 Easter Sunday

Easter Lilies will be used to decorate the altar on Easter Sunday. You may order your own Easter lily for \$10.00 and then take it home with you after the service. Please see your bulletin for an order form or contact he church office.



R.E.S.T. DINNERS CONTINUE March 12



Community Life – Because residents live close together, use the central laundry, come to the community center for food, to report repair needs, etc., the residents are very aware of what's happening to their neighbors, who is ill, etc. In short, it is a close knit community. The two recent deaths have been deeply felt and the remembrances in the community center well attended. Several serious illnesses have brought out the normal human caring. The unusual

number of recent vacancies, new arrivals, and movement of residents to different apartments will understandably change the dynamic among neighbors.

Management believes the vacancies are at an end for now. New tenants have been identified and are moving in. Converting one apartment to an ADA compliant apartment is in the final stage. Thus, we will be able to take care of a current resident's needs.

Selection of new tenants – We follow HUD rules for selecting tenants. If there are not interested applicants on our waiting lists by apartment size, we advertise in the IJ. Running the ad for one week produces enough applicants. We process the applicants on a first in basis. After a tenant is qualified, we maintain the remaining applicants on the list for the next vacancy in that apartment size. Whenever a vacancy occurs, we give preference to existing tenants who qualify because of family size for a larger apartment. Conversely, if a tenant's family size has decreased, we encourage them to downsize. Existing tenants can also qualify for a subsidized apartment when those become available. About half of the apartments are subsidized under Section 8.

Next Board Meeting – Scheduled for March 7 in the community center.

Church members or friends may contact me or Margie Rollman at Pilgrim Park to learn about vacancies. Margie receives inquiries daily. High quality affordable housing is scarce and in much demand.

MOVIE NIGHT MARCH 2 - SPOTLIGHT

(Note: Due to scheduling problems this is the slightly-delayed "February" Movie Night. Our regular March movie night will be Friday March 30.)

The newsrooms big city newspapers have always provided a stage for great drama, and perhaps the endangered status of newspapers in the age of the internet explains the upsurge of terrific newspaper movies in recent years.

Arguably the best of the recent newsroom dramas is *Spotlight* which won the Best Picture and Best Original Screenplay Oscars for 2015. (It was also recently in the news again, when one of its central characters, Cardinal Bernard Law, disgraced ex-Archbishop of Boston, died in Rome in December.)



Spotlight tells the story of an investigative unit at The Boston Globe that set out to report on what they thought was a single rogue priest whose history of child abuse was being covered-up by the church. They persisted in their investigation despite efforts by most of Boston's establishment to shut them down. By the time they published, a year later, they had lifted the lid on a self-inflicted wound to the Catholic church that is still not fully resolved.

Interestingly, *Spotlight* was written and directed by Tom McCarthy, who was previously known for small, thoughtful dramas like *The Station Agent* and *The Visitor* (both of which we've seen on Movie Night) and who is Catholic and a graduate of Boston College.

"The movie celebrates a specific professional accomplishment and beautifully captures the ethos of journalism. It is also a defense of professionalism in a culture that increasingly holds it in contempt. Everything in this movie works, which is only fitting, since its vision of heroism involves showing up in the morning and — whether inspired by bosses or in spite of them — doing the job."


