#### The Amazing Power of Praise June 2 **Communion Sunday**

(Philippians 4: 4-6) Acts 16: 16-34 tells the story of Paul and his companion Silas being unjustly arrested, beaten, and thrown into prison. While there, Paul follows his own advice and spends the time singing hymns to God and praying. And amazing things happen! Pastor Sally will reflect on the power of praise and share with you a modern day story that shows once again that amazing things can happen when we rejoice and pray.



### **PILLOW SUNDAY - JUNE 9**

The Mission Board's collection of pillows for Homeward Bound/New Beginnings will be held on June 9 this year.

New Beginnings is an 80-bed shelter for single, homeless adults. The Center combines job training and work experience opportunities with shelter. The residents are expected of engage in developing plans for stable housing. 16 beds are provided for homeless veterans.



New Beginnings offers on-site training in their Fresh Starts Culinary Academy, in addition to paid apprenticeships in janitorial and building maintenance and in landscaping and garden maintenance.

#### **PILGRIM PARK NEWS**

**General** – As we end our 2018/2019 fiscal year, we can report close to budgeted results, no vacancies for many months and many improvements. Pilgrim Park remains in strong financial condition.



Improvements – Major landscaping, three new

second level decks, repairs to the second level entrance to the manager's apartment and renovation of three apartments. When we did the major renovation about 13 years ago, we were unable to repair 7 of the second level decks. We had found that all second story decks were experiencing structural rot due to inadequate waterproofing during initial construction. The three decks we did this year were the last ones unrepaired.

The major new landscaping includes the area seen from the pastor's office. To add interest we have pruned a young oak into a large Bonzai, added a rock, some succulents and a blooming tree. Later we'll plant spring blooming bulbs.

At year-end, we are working on replanting the areas on either side of the entry to the church and Pilgrim Park The last phase of the relandscaping will be on North San Pedro just to the right of the sidewalk leading to Pilgrim Park and on church property.

**Community Garden** – A near miracle is occurring near the church as the tenant tended vegetables close to the Oak Room. Just go through the gate and turn left to see tomatoes, strawberries, radish, garlic and many other veggies literally leap up from the care of PP tenants. Some tenants visit their plots several times a day to urge growth. One tomato plant has three large green tomatoes.

**Directors' Activities** – The six directors continue to meet quarterly and recently in a partial day retreat to monitor the management and to consider the future of Pilgrim Park.

**Tenant News** – Tenant activities including Saturday yoga, Zumba, monthly movies by Bob Spofford, five day a week free food deliveries and computer activities continue. Several residents, in a spirit of community, volunteered to assist another tenant who suffered a series of unexpected illnesses. She is doing better.

**Coming Attractions** – This is the summer for the Pilgrim Park picnic for residents and church members. Stay tuned for a date announcement which will probably be in August.



#### **MOVIE NIGHT JUNE 28 - THE TRUMAN SHOW**

This year Movie Night is alternating between current films and classics from years gone by. Our June film is a mere 21 years old, and is only now starting to be seen as a "classic." That's because it starred Jim Carrey, who at the time was known only for broad, clownish characters, and because it was marketed as a lightweight summer comedy.

In reality, *The Truman Show* is a serious satire on the world of TV and our public obsessions with made-up characters. It was directed by Peter Weir (*The Year of Living Dangerously, Dead Poets Society*) and Carrey's co-stars were "serious" A-list actors: Laura Linney and Ed Harris.



Carrey plays Truman Burbank, who from the day he was born, has been the unwitting star of a 24-hour reality TV show. His neighbors, his co-workers, even his wife are all actors, and his every move is broadcast by hidden cameras. Truman is the only one not in on the joke. He believes this is the real world, and the drama kicks in when he starts asking questions.


