The Word Became Flesh

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from God, full of grace and truth." John 1:14

As I'm writing this article near Thanksgiving, Christmas is just around the corner. Are you ready? What kind of Christmas will it be for you this year? Perhaps it will be extra special after Covid sheltering last year. Christmas has changed for me over the years, though the essence of it remains the same. As the angel said to the shepherds, "Do not be

to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." Lk 2:10-11

Our circumstances and the context of Christmas are constantly changing. Gone are the

days of toys and the excitement of eagerly

waiting for Santa. Perhaps there are not as many family members gathered around the tree and the table anymore as they have gone home to experience Christmas in the Kingdom. Christmas becomes difficult for many people because it is not what it used to be. But as people of faith, we can believe that Christmas can still be rich and inspiring. The reason is quite simple. As John writes, "The Word dwelt among us . . . and we have seen His glory."

Such wisdom was likely hidden from our eyes when we were young. It takes a season of living with the Spirit before we can see on our horizon the same star the shepherds saw. For many years we may have dwelled alone in the realm of Christmas Past until finally deciding to travel today with the Wise Men. This year may be the time when we step away from the busyness of the season, while calming our hearts and minds in order to hear the words of the angel whispered to us ...'Behold I bring you Good News ...'

Growing older can mean growing wiser in ways we never imagined, as Richard Rohr points out. Even if our eyesight grows dim, the dazzling glory of the Lord lights the way. For me, it also means that the poignancy of Christmases past flow into the present



moment, and we behold the mystery that even those who are gone from our sight are with us at this very moment. We all fall to our knees together and worship the One who came, yet comes again. (continued on the next page) This can be the year when we experience God in new ways as we worship in spirit and in truth. The veil between heaven and earth is thinner than we think. As Gerard Manley Hopkins writes, "The world is charged with the grandeur of God." Never is this truer than at Christmas.

Like Mary, we can "treasure up all these things" and ponder them in our hearts. This Christmas the Word will come again and dwell with you. Heaven and earth will join together, and the glory of the Lord will shine in you brighter than ever. Let your light shine!




ADVENT REFLECTION GROUP

Dec. 5 Second Sunday in Advent

Moving From Darkness Into Light Isaiah 9:2, 6-7 John 1:1-9; 3:19-21

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined." - Isaiah 9:2

We are in the darkest month of the year. The days are shorter and the nights are longer. You go home in the dark . . . go to work in the dark, and probably spend many of your waking hours in the dark. The ancients feared this time of the year. They were afraid the sun might sink on the horizon, and never return again. In some ways we have remnants of that primordial fear. We know something about that darkness as well. There are those who are worried, anxious and depressed, or experiencing self-doubt. Advent is a time face the darkness. We can hold fast to the hope expressed by Isaiah and John the Baptist.

Dec. 12 Third Sunday in Advent

Miracles Still Happen

Isaiah 7:10-16; Matthew 1:18-25

Joseph was engaged to Mary, but before they could be married, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Joseph agonized and wondered if he should go ahead with the wedding. But an angel appeared to him in a dream, and assured him this was part of God's plan, and he should go ahead with the marriage. This is the time of year when the veil between heaven and earth is particularly thin. What are the dreams God is whispering to you? What is the angel's clarion call in your life? Advent is a season of mystery and imagination.

Dec. 19 Fourth Sunday in Advent What Did the Animals Know: Isaiah 9:2-3, 6-7; Luke 2:8-12

Have you ever paused to think about what life must have been like around the stable on that first Christmas? We have a visible reminder every time we behold a nativity scene. One thing we know -- us was surrounded by animals at the time of his birth. In Isaiah 1:3 we read: 3 The ox knows his master, the donkey his owner's manger, but Israel does not know, my people do not understand." Did the animals know that something special was taking place at the manager that night? I like to think about what life must have been like around the stable on that first Christmas. It was no accident that the animals were there to greet the baby Jesus.



MODERATOR'S REPORT

As we approach the holidays, the Church Council is working with the Board of Trustees, the Board of Ministry, and the Choir, to provide safe space for worship. This is a difficult, but necessary, task during this time when Covid continues to plague us.



At this point, we are continuing the requirement of wearing masks and social distancing. We will continue to keep most windows and doors open, but the use of space heaters should help.

Speakers who are standing alone at the pulpit may be unmasked while speaking. Therefore, we will not have the congregation sitting in the first two pews.

For our members who cannot be comfortable in the sanctuary, the live streaming of the Zoom service will continue, and we hope improvements in this are in the works.

We realize Marin County has done a pretty remarkable job of vaccination; however, many people are now moving about more, and Covid is still very active around us. I am sure that the safety measures will not be agreeable to everyone. Please know that the Church Council members struggled to come up with protocols that cover safety with a nod to comfort.

Having written all this, I want so much for us to be able to focus on the Christmas message, to worship together as a church family, and to find the joy in Christ's birth.



INCREASING COVID SAFETY

Due to the continuing pandemic and a predicted winter surge we continue to be cautious, even though we think everybody has been vaccinated. We are adding an extra layer of protection by ordering two new large room air purifiers. These air purifiers are the highest rated in Consumers Reports testing. They have hospital grade H-13 filters which will completely purify the air in the sanctuary every 30 minutes. We have been keeping the windows open to improve ventilation, but that can make things cold. To make sure everybody is warm enough, we have reset the thermostat and raised the temperature. We are also prepared to offer space heaters if needed.
