The Season of Epiphany: Let God's Light Shine!

The season of Epiphany officially begins on Thursday, January 6, and lasts for six weeks, ending just in time for Ash Wednesday and Lent. Epiphany follows twelve days after Christmas, and celebrates the manifestation or appearing of


God's light in Jesus. Remember the song, The Twelve Days of Christmas? It takes us right up to Epiphany! Historically, Epiphany calls to mind the journey of the Magi as they followed the star to pay homage to the Christ child (Matthew 2:1:12). Legend has it that the Magi travelled for twelve days to find the baby Jesus.

Epiphany comes at a time when we're ready for some light. We are emerging from a season of long nights and short days. We get up in the dark and come home in the dark. Much of what we do at this time of year is shrouded in dark-

ness. The ancients feared this time of year, believing that the sun may disappear and never return. It's easy to understand why. For some, that primordial fear remains and is internalized. The power of darkness can pervade our spiritual landscape as well. The great hymn, "O Little Town of Bethlehem" speaks to this condition when it proclaims,

"Yet in thy dark streets shineth The everlasting Light, The hopes and fears of all the years Are met in thee tonight."

How will the promise of light and new beginnings be manifested in your life in this New Year of our Lord? One way might be to look for new perspectives and different roads God might be leading you to travel. Matthew's gospel tells us that after following the star and bringing gifts to the Christ child, the wisemen were warned in a dream to return to their home country by another road.



Even Mary and Joseph did not have time to settle down, as they hastily took flight to Egypt for the safety of mother and child. What adventures and new discoveries await as you take "another road?" Where will the star lead? May this New Year find you ready to follow the star as you travel a different road, one that is filled with wisdom and light.

# January 16 Second Sunday after Epiphany A Resolution That Lasts

Lamentations 3:21-26; Colossians 1:9-12; Philippians 1:3-6

3 I thank my God every time I remember you. 4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, 6 being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. Philippians 1:3-6.

We are only two weeks into the New Year, and it's still not too late to make some New Year's resolutions. How about you? Did you make some resolutions this year? If you made them, are you still keeping them? Regardless of your goals, as people of faith, it may be better to focus on a resolution that lasts. Unlike happiness which can be fleeting, true joy is a gift from God, and will endure regardless of your outward circumstances. We will consider some examples that are sure to bring joy in the New Year.

### January 23 Third Sunday after Epiphany

Today Is the Day! Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10; Luke 4:14-21

Our Old Testament lesson from Nehemiah details the dramatic discovery of a Torah scroll found in the walls during the rebuilding of Jerusalem. It is a scroll that contained the words of Israel's law, and the people weep at the revelation. In Luke, Jesus returns home as he is about to begin his Galilean ministry. He is reading the scroll in the temple: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." What is the meaning of his words, and why is today the most important day to experience his presence?





# January 30 Fourth Sunday after Epiphany Why Should You Weep?

Lamentations 1:1-4, 11-12; Luke 19:41-44

Frederick Buechner once said that it would help us all if we would keep track of the times and events in our lives that bring tears to our eyes. They may be joyful or sad moments. It may be at an unexpected time or place. Whenever you are stirred to such depths, these are special times that God is at work in your life. These occasions are like windows through which the light of God's love shines. Check the times and places where you weep, said Buechner, and you will see the places where God was closer than we might think.

### **UPDATE FROM THE TRUSTEES**

### Improvements in Zooming

Due to an anonymous donor, FCC has been able to improve the quality of our live streaming through Zoom. With Covid concerns increasing, we hope better streaming will enable more people to stay safe but keep connected when we have live services.



Since we came back live last Easter, we had been showing the service live to a few members using just a cell phone on a tripod. We have been told the picture quality was OK, sermon sound was mostly audible, but the music sound was terrible.

Now we will be running the sound from the church's sound system through a Canon camcorder to a new laptop which streams via wi-fi to the internet and Zoom. We are told the picture and sound quality are vastly better.

We still need to improve the camera work to make closeups and wide shots more smooth. We also think we will be able to improve the music quality even more. We expect to be able to record services and post them on the church's website and YouTube.

We still need to add to the camera crew so we don't have to depend on one person. It is really not that hard to learn. You can do it! Contact David.


Due to the pandemic, the focus of

An update from one of our church family, Saba Dempsey.

### **Oron Primary School**

West Pokot Kenya

Dear First Congregational Church San Rafael Family,

I hope that this email finds you all safe and well. I cannot believe that we are already at the end of 2021. We want to thank you again on behalf of the children and staff at the Oron primary school for your gener-



ous donations last year that accomplished a lot at the school. Thankfully this year, the schools in West Pokot Kenya have remained open, and the children have not had disrupted learning due to Covid 19.

Your generous donation has not only gone towards the running of an educational facility, as so much more has been gained physically, emotionally and mentally. Going to the school guarantees the children three nutritious meals a day, readily available healthcare should they get sick, a change of clothes and comfortable beds to sleep in. These things in materially impoverished regions in Kenya are a luxury.

Amongst other things, your contribution last year was put towards the following:

- \* Covering full and partial costs of fees for the families who cannot afford them.
- \* We have dug a well in the school compound so the children have access to fresh clean water.
- \* We erected new fencing around the school grounds.
- \* We have built a dining area so the children can have their meals under shelter.
- \* We bought secondhand story books and brand new games for the library.
- We bought outdoor games equipment like soccer balls, badminton sets and skipping ropes.
- We are working on the school starting their own edible garden that the children can tend to.
- We recently bought ten milk goats to provide the school with milk.

We are aware that giving is a sacrifice during this Covid crisis and appreciate the assistance you have given us. If you would like to make contributions towards the community at the Oron Primary School, any amount that you can give would make a big difference. All contributions go to the school 100% without a processing fee. Again this year, Mtelo Ministries has agreed to process the donations and you send tax receipts.
