COME ONE, COME ALL ON MAY 15! - HEAR THE GOOD NEWS! PROPOSED TERM MINISTER

Upon the upon the recommendation of the Interim Search Committee and the Church Council, we will have a Congregation Meeting of First Congregational Church of San Rafael on May15th to prayerfully consider a call to Rev. Barbara Peronteau to be our designated term pastor for at least 18 months.

Rev. Peronteau has specialized in helping churches with transitions, is an excellent preacher, and comes with superb recommendations. On the next page, you will find a brief description of Rev. Peronteau.

A designated term call is a bit different from the usual Interim Call. An Interim pastor focuses on helping a congregation find a settled pastor, is open-ended, but the church may not consider the interim pastor for a settled



position by UCC and Conference rules. A call to pastor to a designated term provides time for us to be the church, and to discern more fully our mission and ministry. After 18 months, the call may be extended, ended, or changed by a vote of the church council and the call renegotiated. It may be changed to a settled position (by mutual agreement) or changed to an interim agreement in which the congregation proceeds to create a Search Committee for a settled pastor, writes a profile, and seeks candidates. During the designated time, the church does not search for other pastors.

On Sunday the 15th of May we will be led in worship by Rev. Peronteau. It will be a hybrid church service and meeting (both in church and on ZOOM) to allow the maximum number of our members to participate. Immediately afterward we will have a congregation meeting. Then, we will enjoy a delicious lunch in the courtyard and celebrate our community.

We look forward to presenting Rev. Peronteau to the congregation for your approval.

INTRODUCING REV. BARBARA PERONTEAU

The Interim Search Committee, the Board of Trustees, and the Church Council are recommending Rev. Barbara Peronteau to be called by the congregation to be our Designated Term pastor for at least 18 months at 60% time.

She has impressed the Search Committee with how her faith journey led her to feeling called to intentional interim ministry. She has a depth of experience and training with pastoring church transitions. She most recently was the bridge pastor at Arlington Church in Kensington and an interim at St James Lutheran Church in San Leandro. She has also been interim pastor for churches in Pennsylvania, Colorado, and Ohio.

One reference told the committee "she has helped us with a vision while letting go of things holding us back, encouraging us to do better and not just go back to the good old days."

Her references describe her as:

- an empathetic listener
- having a strong personal faith,
- able to speak of God in a down-to-earth way
- genuine
- a good communicator
- a strong preacher
- committed to social justice and inclusion
- gets along with everybody
- laughs easily
- clear about God's grace.

She earned her Master of Divinity at Union Seminary in Virginia in 1988, and competed Level II Clinical Pastor Education Training in Reading, PA. She has also worked as a hospital chaplain and developed HIV/AIDs hospital chaplaincy as well as women's transgender hospital chaplaincy. She was ordained as a UCC minister in 1988.

She is publishing a "side bar" on the Book of Judith for a biblical commentary to be published this fall and this month is one of three speakers on a nation-wide Zoom on pastoring in and with the transgender community.

The Interim Search Committee feels that Barbara's passion and skills working with church transitions and pastoral care are just what will help FCC move on to a robust, healthy, church community.
