
The Microscope and the Telescope

Welcome to Rev. Barbara Peronteau

On May 15, Rev. Barbara Peronteau, the candidate selected by the Interim Search Committee as our next minister, was the guest preacher. Following worship, there was a congregational meeting, and Rev, Peronteau was presented to the congregation

as a proposed 'Designated Term' pastor. After a series of questions, initially asked of Rev. Peronteau, and a follow-up group of questions and comments from the congregation, Rev. Peronteau was selected unanimously by the congregation to serve as our pastor for an 18month time period.

A Designated Term Pastor is someone that is selected for a determined length of time, during which the church has a chance to examine itself and reflect on who we are and what we need going forward. Barbara Peronteau has had extensive experience in working with churches during transition periods. At the end of the 18 months, the term can be extended, the contract can be ended, or the designated term can be shifted into a settled pastor.

We look forward to this time with Pastor Barbara!

I'd like to give a special thanks to the search committee comprised of Lynn Grant, Cathy Fuller, and Jackie Dema for their diligent work in searching and finding an outstanding choice for our church.

Rev. Peronteau's Notes on the Scripture Selections

All scripture suggestions are from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL). Beginning with the Second Sunday after Pentecost (June 19) the RCL gives us the option of two scripture lessons and a Psalm from the Hebrew Testament. The first option is called "semi-continuous." The lessons in the Hebrew Testament will follow each other, but not right after each other, as you can see. The second option is called "complimentary" or "paired." This option is more thematic with the Epistle and Gospel. The note in my calendar suggests picking one, "semi-continuous" or "complimentary" and then stick with that through the entire Season after Pentecost or what is also known as Ordinary Time. For your own personal devotions I suggest both.

UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST RESPONDS TO RUSSIAN INVASION



First Congregational Church of San Rafael designated three Sundays in April for our congregations' special relief appeal. Thanks to our congregation who gave so generously, as \$625 was raised in this appeal.

The United Church of Christ is appealing for support for refugees who have fled Ukraine to neighboring countries and for elderly and other vulnerable people who are displaced

within Ukraine and unable to leave. As a member of the ACT Alliance, UCC support is being targeted to people most in need through humanitarian relief partners with a history of working in the region.

Gifts made to UCC Ukraine Relief Fund will provide shelter, food, and other care to war refugees and internally displaced people. It also will help refugees and asylum seekers from African, Middle Eastern, and other countries who had sought refuge in Ukraine and now are twice displaced, as well as citizens of more than 125 other countries living in Ukraine. Uniting in prayer, action, and giving, we stand as a people of faith in love and compassion with the people of Ukraine and all who are affected, and with our global partners who are welcoming those driven from their homes.


MARIN FOOD BANK




