THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR... REV. BARBARA PERONTEAU



In my last session with my Spiritual Director, not that it was my last session, but more like the last time I talked to him last session, the conversation somehow drifted to Advent. Actually, my Spiritual Director asked me point blank what Advent means to me. How we arrived at the point of him asking me what Advent means to me, I don't remember. I remember the question though.

So, I'll ask you. What does Advent mean to you?


I admit to having some spiritual envy of other world religions. I envy the meditative practices of the Buddhists. I envy the many holy days and festivals the Jewish tradition has, such as Rosh

Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Hanukkah, Purim, and Passover. I am envious of how Muslims know their faith are able to, not only quote, but to theologize the meaning of, say Mary and the birth of Jesus. That's when I remember I am a Christian who loves the wonder of the Christian Faith and the beauty of the Church, when, in its best moments, it remembers it is the Body of Christ sharing her most precious gift that is Grace itself. I am reminded the Church has its own contemplative practices inspired by Saint Ignatius for example, and the meditative discipline of the Lectio Divina of Benedict of Nursia from the sixth century. I am reminded the Church has her own holy days throughout the Church year pointing to the Church, to God and Jesus, and the ways in which Jesus wants us to walk as though we are truly inspired and empowered by a Spirit that is Sacred and Other. In this new year of the Church, we call Advent, we are reminded of the many ways in which we understand Mary and the Birth of Jesus.

Advent is not Christmas-light. Advent is not mini-Christmas. While the rest of our culture goes nutty for Christmas songs and shopping, we are given the gift of four weeks ahead of the day we celebrate the Divine Light of the World born into this time and place as one of us.

And so, Advent, when done right, reminds us what the world so desperately longs for and so desperately needs. Advent is a season of Hope as we Hope for Peace, Joy, and Love. Who knew that God would be born among us

in the tears and cries of the very epitome of vulnerability itself - a helpless baby reaching out to be held. Fully God and Fully Human.





My hope for this Advent is that we become aware of our own desire for Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love not only in our own lives, but also in the lives of others, and for the life of the world. Advent is when we reach out and touch the One who is reaching out for us, Jesus Christ who is born this day and every day in the City of David and within our human hearts.



CHRISTMAS DRAMA - YOUR CHANCE TO BE A STAR
