THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR... REV. BARBARA PERONTEAU



It was somewhere around this time of year as 1986 turned into 1987 when two of my seminary friends and I drove up from Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond to a Trappist Monastery in the Appalachian Mountains near Berryville, Virginia. We arrived on the 29th or 30th of December and would leave on January 2. It was a retreat of a lifetime.

I don't think any of us had a camera with us, but the memories of that extended weekend, remain seared into my memory. I remember Brother James who was a nationally known expert on the Civil War. I found it odd that a person dedicated to the monastic life would be an expert on the Civil War. As it turns out Brother James' unique avocation found him. As

he would take his meditative walks through the mountains where Virginia meets the eastern most arm of West Virginia, Brother James would find musket balls, cannon balls, knives, bayonets, and various military

insignias designating troop or rank. Brother James became curious about the artifacts he was finding on his walks and would become an expert.

Another memory I have is eating in the refectory with the Brothers. Some meals were had in silence while others were noisy celebrations of the day. The Brother in charge of preparing the meals was on the grumbly side one day as the provisions he was expecting hadn't arrived and the pantry was getting low. I vaguely remember something about having cabbage, but not enough. "Oh well," he said, "I'll make it work." Make it work, he did. Every meal was perfect in a "less is more" simple kind of way.

As part of the retreat my two friends and I were expected to attend worship for the various Daily Offices scheduled throughout the day at the chapel. We asked if there was Communion and if so, could we participate? The Brothers asked us one question. "Do you believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist?" The answer, of course was "yes." We weren't asked if we believe in "transubstantiation." We were asked about the Real Presence. As Calvinists, the only answer was, yes. In the mystery of this grace-filled meal Christ is somehow present.

The Daily offices are those times during the whole day when the community gathers for prayer.

The daily prayers begin with Matins at 3 in

the morning. Then comes
Lauds at 6 am, Prime was at
7:30 am, followed by Terce at
9 am. The Noonday Prayer is
called Sext (Noon is the sixth
hour of the day beginning
with Sunrise). Nones is at

3 pm, Vespers at 4:30 or 5 when the Monks had their evening meal before dark. The day finished with Compline at 7, just in time for bed.

I missed one Matins and one Lauds. My spirit, filled with good intentions, was totally willing, but my body said, "Absolutely not



today." The chanting of the Monks was uplifting and mesmerizing, allowing body, mind, and spirit to be touched by the Sacred Other. In the singing and the chanting, I wondered if God was brought low to me, or if it was me who was lifted to a sacred otherness? Perhaps both.

When I add up all my memories, I remember there being a sense of timelessness to that weekend as 1986 turned into 1987. As our friends and colleagues back at the seminary were celebrating the New Year with beer and soda and pizza and holiday noise makers, there was none of that at the Monastery in Berryville, Virginia. There was a timeless rhythm that focused and centered on Jesus Christ and the gathered community at worship, prayer, and a life together.

I'll see you as we gather for the season of Epiphany as the revealing of Jesus Christ continues.


SAVE THE DATE: FEB. 5 AT 11 AM

CHRISTMAS PAGEANT IN FOUR PARTS

Usually we think of the Christmas story as having the shepherds gather round while the magi kneel with their treasures. It sure seems crowded! Since Luke and Matthew tell very different stories as preludes to their gospels, we are presenting their accounts separately.

This year in December we first showed Luke's version, emphasizing Mary's devotion and social justice in her Magnificat. The second week we saw the angels announce Christ's coming, first for the lower classes such as shepherds, and we saw the shepherds' enthusiastic response.









In January (January 1 and January 8), we will show Matthew's version with Joseph's dream. On Epiphany we remember the Magi's visit, possibly as much as two years after the birth of Jesus. Matthew links his version to the slavery and liberation from Egypt, and Jesus as the new Moses who is more important than Caesar.
