#### THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR... REV. BARBARA PERONTEAU



# 130 years!

You might already know the first part of this essay. For my first class at Pacific School of Religion, I needed to turn in a bibliography, a table of contents which would serve as an outline of my doctoral project, and something about the context of where I am doing ministry.

Part of the ministry context required I share the history of First Congregational Church. I was already familiar with the broad-brush strokes of FCC's history and how our beginning was formed by a group of people heavily involved with the Temperance Movement in the late 1800s. I needed some details about the dates, so I went to the website.

The first thing I noticed was the date FCC first met for worship was March 5, 1893, exactly 130 years ago to the day! It was in

March, 1894 that FCC was fully incorporated under California state law.

My immediate takeaways were that we need to begin our celebration now. Indeed, your Celebration Committee is Val Sherer, Julie Dowling, Denise Walker, and me. I also noticed we have a full year to celebrate, and, thirdly, the dates of 1893 and 2023 coincide exactly. March 5 in 1893 is the same day and date as March 5 in 2023. This adds a whole other layer of cosmic excitement.

As I tend to do, I began to wonder how it is that a congregation born out of the Temperance Movement transformed into a progressive, Open and Affirming Congregation, involved in immigration justice? My thoughts immediately went to our Congregational faith ancestors, the Pilgrims and present-day Provincetown, Massachusetts.

The Pilgrims, who were not referred to as Pilgrims until 1820, thought of themselves as Puritans. They wanted to purify the excesses of the Church of England. When they found that purifying the Church would be impossible, the Puritans became known as

Separatists. They found safe haven in Leiden, Holland. The parents, however, noticed that their children were becoming assimilated into the Dutch culture. They were afraid they were losing their English identity. Eventually, on September 16, 1620, the Mayflower set sail from Plymouth, England, for the New World. They were headed for what we now know as New York. A series

of storms blew the Mayflower off course. On November 9, 1620, sixty-six days after leaving England, they made landfall in a protected cove where the "fist" curls under the arm of Cape Cod.



Today, the town of Provincetown, Massachusetts, serves as a magnet to history buffs and whale watchers, and also as a safe haven for the LGBTQ+ population. I wondered what the connection is. Then it dawned on me. Provincetown, then as now, has always been about seeking freedom, a new start, and the opportunity to be and express our authentic selves.

So, back to present day FCC and the connection to the temperance movement of 1893. Until the prohibition of alcohol became the obsessive target, it was never about the alcohol. It was always about family, our marriages, and relationships. It was about personal responsibility, and our emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual health. It was about the safe and secure structure of a loving caring family,



community, and culture. And like the progressive, loving, caring, and inclusive nature of First Congregational Church now, and as it was then, FCC is, and always has been, about justice and the safe and secure structure of family, community, culture, and faith.

For 130 years First Congregational Church has proclaimed the love of Jesus Christ for all people. It's just who we are. Let the celebrations begin!

### First Congregational Church of San Rafael is 130 years old!

In 1993, we celebrated our Centennial. Now, 30 years later, we again celebrate our past, present, and future. Pastor Barbara brought this to our attention in January when she did some research into the church as part of her initial assignments in her Doctorate program at Pacific School of Religion. A small committee has begun plans for a year-long celebration of our church, beginning with the first Communion service on March 5, 1893, and leading to our incorporation on March 12, 1894. We were delighted to learn that the 1893 calendar is identical to the 2023 calendar.

San Rafael Welcomes a New Church Dateline March 5, 1893



The first Communion service at the new First Congregational Church of San Rafael will be held at 10 am, March 5, 1893.

The First Congregational Church of San Rafael grew out of a Bible Class formed by Mrs. Emmaline A. Haskell in November, 1892. This Bible Class of six to ten members met at the Boarding-house home of Mrs. M. McDonald on the corner of B and Second Streets.

On Sunday, December 25, 1892, the members of the

Bible Class met for the first time in the "Y's" hall, on the corner of Third and B Streets. This hall, over W. N. Anderson's store, was rented by the Young People's Branch of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, from whom the class obtained the use of it.

On January 11, 1893, a notice was published in the Marin Journal that Congregational services would be held in the "Y's" hall on January 15. The Rev. William P. Hardy, the first Pastor, conducted the first regular service of the Church. Eighteen people were present.

The Manual of the First Congregational Church, containing the statement of Doctrine, Confession of Faith, Covenant, and Constitution, was adopted on Sunday, February 12, 1893. On February 19, 1893, 13 people became Charter Members.




