There are new beginnings throughout the year.

September holds the end of Summer and the beginning of a new school year.

Thanksgiving, at the end of November, marks the beginning of a new holiday season with all its festivities including Christmas and ending, of course, with a brand-new New Year. Easter rolls away the stone of a dark and cold winter allowing more sunlight and a fresh renew of life.

At the end of May, Summer begins with the unofficial opening on Memorial Day. The door is open to Summer which begins in June. June is yet another time of new beginnings. School is out for the Summer. For those

There are different ways to understand when summer begins. The Astronomical Summer begins on June 21 and lasts until September 23. The second set of Old Testament and Psalm readings is called complimentary (paired). In this set of readings, the connection to the Epistle and Gospel is a more obvious.

BOARD OF TRUSTEE'S REPORT

Food Anonymous, a support group for people struggling with food issues, has added a second meeting day, Wednesday evenings, in the Oak Room.

Facility Upkeep

During May we had a variety of minor tasks to keep everything going smoothly. The restroom lock needed replacing as did several smoke alarm batteries. Firemaster checked our fire extinguishers and replaced those needed recharge. We also tried to keep the weeds under control. On the list for June will be more weeding, repairing a couple of folding tables, and having the drains de-rooted, which is necessary about twice a year.

Unfortunately, the door to the nursery classroom (The Seedling Room) appeared to be locked, but wasn't, and the tea cart and several boxes of cookies are now missing. We have since tightened the slightly sagging door, so the door lock engages better.

Financial status

We continue holding our own financially. Our income as of May 15 was \$266 dollars more than we expected to date for 2023. Thank you, members, for keeping up your pledges! Our expenses so far have been below expected, but we usually have several large end-of-the-year expenses in December. Also, our PG&E charges have been up by about \$1500 so far this year.

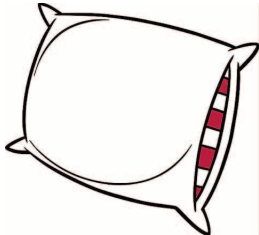

If shopping for pillows presents a hardship, please let a Mission Board member know. Thank you for your continued commitment to Homeward Bound's mission.

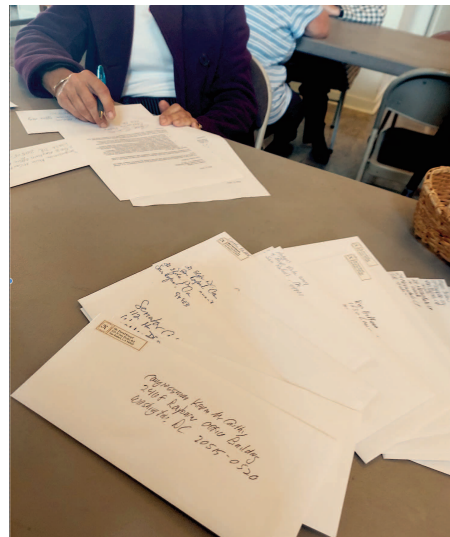
Let's see how many pillows we can provide for some of these beds!
