

October 8: Blessing of the Animals

October 15: Rev. Blythe Osner led worship while Pr.Barbara was in Pennsylvania for a class reunion. The Rev. Blythe Osner served as pastor of United Church of Christ in Petaluma for 12 years before following her passion for education and social justice into the classroom where she currently teaches middle school at a Waldorf in Petaluma.

October 22: Rev. Dr. Davena Jones, our NCNC Conference Minister, led us in worship and reflected on the challenging scripture "Render unto Caesar, What is Caesar's and to God, what is God's." She led us in discussion following worship to share about Pastor Barbara's time with us coming to a close and to discuss the next steps for our community in this time of transition. We were left with the immediate challenge to prayerfully consider if we might feel called to participate in the search for an interim pastor.

October 29th: Reformation Sunday. The Rev. Bill Eichhorn is a recently retired UCC pastor, previously at Mill Valley and most recently with his wife, Ann, at Tiburon UCC. He preached on the theme of hope in desperate times. He closed with "A Blessing" (following) that resonated with us when we are all reeling from mass shooting in Maine, war in Ukraine, massacres in Israel and Gaza and following so soon on devastating natural disasters and fires around the world.


