BOARD OF MINISTRY REPORT

WORSHIP in December:

Dec. 3 - First Sunday of Advent: HOPE Rev. Jorge Bautista preached. He was raised in San Jose, Ca after his mother migrated who migrated from Michoacán, Mexico to Stockton (where she worked in the asparagus fields). He spent most of his youth in San Jose, CA. He has been in ministry since 1998. The first fifteen years of ministry was focused on prison ministry with California Youth Outreach in San Jose, and Youth For Christ in Chicago. The last ten



years he was as a full time pastor at the Congregational Church of San Mateo UCC.

Dec. 10 - Second Sunday of Advent: PEACE. Rev. Bill Eichhorn preached on "That Awful and Wonderful Yes." The Rev. Bill Eichhorn was a long time pastor at Mill Valley Community Church and bridge pastor with his wife at Tiburon Community Church.

Dec. 17 - Third Sunday of Advent: JOY. Rev. Nick Morris sermon told stories of recognizing the gifts of joy and gratitude when welcoming in "The Stranger."

Nick Morris is Executive Director at The Street Chaplaincy. The Street Chaplaincy's primary mission is to bring compassionate spiritual care to unsheltered persons living in Marin County and to build community between homeless persons and non-homeless faith communities and other organizations. Nick has a B.A. from Duke University and a Master of Divinity (MDiv) from San Francisco Theological Seminary. He is the former Multi-Cultural Minister at Good News Presbyterian Church, a Korean American congregation based in San Francisco. His mission work includes church planting and the creation of Project Shelter, an ongoing effort to help the poor in Tijuana, Mexico.

Dec. 24 - Fourth Sunday of Advent: LOVE. Rev. Barry Cammer preached on "Love, Too Much and Not Enough." The sanctuary was filled with poinsettias to honor of loved ones, and the cross once again was bedecked. Rev. Cammer has been an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ since 1987. He served as a parish pastor for 8 years before choosing affordable housing as his designated ministry for almost 30 years.

Dec. 24th - 7 pm Christmas Eve. We had a family service telling the Christmas Story through Scripture, hymns and the placing of the holy family and the angels and shepherds in the crèche as the story progresses. We ended with lighting one anothers' candles as we processed to the Courtyard singing Silent Light ending under the star lite sky and luminaria lit courtyard. It was a joy to see church family who came from a distance.

Dec. 24th - 11 pm Christmas Eve. "It came upon a Midnight Clear," the faithful FCC family members who participate around the "fireside" (an electric heater that looks like a coal fire) enjoy reading the Christmas Story through the scriptures and recorded music ("guest appearances" by YoYo Ma, Mahalia Jackson, Chris Botti and more!). We bring in Christmas Day by sharing hot cider and Gingerbread cookies. Thank you David for bringing these master musical performance to FCC.

Dec. 31 - First Sunday after Christmas: Board of Ministry planned a Taize* style service. Special thanks to Louis and Gerry for picking the hymns and the special music "A Soalin," solo by Louis, backed up by the choir members. The church family were asked to light a candle of Hope for the New Year as they entered the candlelit Sanctuary where we participated in singing Taize hymns, meditated on scripture ("Lectio Divina" practice) and reflected on a Rumi and an

Amanda Gorman poem. Participants expressed delight that we were able to have a meaningful service moving into the New Year, even without a sermon!

Taizé is a simple, meditative form of worship using repetitious songs, prayerful silence, and short readings to guide the focus in a prayerful, candle-lit environment. Taizé Prayer is named for the ecumenical Christian community formed in Taizé, France during World War II.



Lectio Divina (Divine Reading) is a traditional monastic practice since the 6th Century, a practice of scriptural reading with meditation and prayer to promote communion with God while increasing knowledge of the Scripture.


