

The year of 2023 was another year of transition and change for our Congregation. Pastor Barbara Peronteau was hired in mid-May 2022. Originally the search was to find an interim Pastor. However, after some discussion with the Trustees, Pastor Barbara suggested she be called for a Designated Term.

In August 2023 as the end date of the term was approaching in November, your Council engaged all active members of First Congregational Church of San Rafael in one-on-one, confidential

interviews. The interviews gathered feedback about several parts of the pastor's job description. These included preaching, organizing worship, providing pastoral care, collaborating with staff and church committees and guiding in a leadership role to move the church forward in the context of what is suitable for our congregation.

The results of the interviews were analyzed at length by your Council. It was decided to discuss the results with Pastor and offer her an Interim position, which was the original intention back in the Spring of 2022. Unfortunately, Pastor Barbara chose to resign.



BOARD OF TRUSTEE'S REPORT



Budget Brief

Our Treasurer reported in the annual meeting that we ended the year with about a \$10,000 surplus, but the budget for 2024 lists a \$22,000 deficit. It assumes we will be paying a pastor at the conference rate for the entire year. We have somewhat less specifically pledged this year, but Financial Officer Val Sherer notes we have

several members who regularly donate but don't pledge. We anticipate increase in utilities and possibly pastor expenses, depending mostly on health insurance needs.

Building Brief

Overflowing toilets caused preschool to close for one day until Roto-Roter could come to clean out the drain. The internal mechanism for one of the toilets downstairs also had to be replaced. The locks to the two upstairs restrooms didn't work well. The locksmith had to replace the lever and bolt lock for the Plum Room restroom, but the Office restroom locks seemed to be working well, unless the door is pushed on strongly from the inside.

Again this year we have had a slight leak from the flat roof part of the Community Room. The roofers have tried to fix it now twice, so we hope the problem is resolved.

AARP Tax Assistance will start in February on Tuesdays. We also make the sanctuary available for people waiting...or who need to pray for their taxes....or pray for the country!



Jan. 7 Rev. Annie Steinberg Behrman

Annie was born in Los Angeles and lived there until 1989. Annie and her family moved to San Anselmo so Annie could attend San



Francisco Theological Seminary. Annie was ordained in 1993 and has served in a variety of churches in California and Oregon. Her most recent church was MCC San Francisco where Annie served as Senior Pastor. Annie loves her animal companions-two dogs and three cats. She lives in Berkeley with her wife Victoria. She currently teaches middle school at a Waldorf inspired charter school in Petaluma. a world view. As a history and literature teacher, she is able to continue her work of connecting story to meaning in a secular setting. She is also a proud mother to two teenage children.



The next book for our Book Club is *Rough Sleepers*, by Tracy Kidder.

Tracy Kidder has been described by The Baltimore Sun as "a master of the nonfiction narrative." In *Rough Sleepers*, Kidder tells the story of Dr. Jim O'Connell, a gifted man who invented a community of care for a city's unhoused population, including those who sleep on the streets—the "rough sleepers." After Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General, the hospital's chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellow-ship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? That year turned into O'Connell's life's calling.

The book is available from both the Marin County Library and the Sonoma County Library. Lucinda will make at least 5 copies for people to borrow from the Sonoma County Library, and they will be available on Sundays before or after worship.


