Our theme for this year is "The Inn: Housing the Holy." Economic disparity runs rampant, locally and globally. As we enter the Advent season, the question is how our churches can become houses where the Holy will be born anew-offering respite, sustenance, and care, opening the doors ever wider to those seeking shelter from the onslaught of life? No one church can do it all, but each can do something. As we study the biblical prophets that call us to care for our neighbors and "make room in the inn," the

lonely and frightened spaces within us are filled with the light of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

A couple of Sundays ago,

I asked if there were people in the congregation who had known each other (through church connections) more then 20, or 30 years...Several hands went up, confirming that this is a community which has held together for a long, long time. This is clearly a community, which has grown together, learned together, and remained committed to the call to make God's love visible in the world.

In the Buddhist tradition, people say that they will take refuge in the Buddha, the Dharma (teachings), and the Sangha (community). There is a deep understanding that as people seek to bring harmony to all, that they need community, that they need people to walk alongside.

Especially in these times of turmoil, unrest, and challenges in our own lives, how do we keep cultivating our connection with the One who calls and sustains us? We often try to find answers to those questions all by ourselves, and tend to make our connection with the Divine more of an individual path and responsibility. At times that may leave us feeling a bit frightened and isolated. The prophets in times of old however, always started their call to the people to return to God with the words: "Hear O Israel." It was the community that was called, called to follow God's laws, called to care for neighbor. God's presence was woven into the very fabric of the community.

We too can take refuge in the community that we are a part of, encouraging one another, caring for one another, learning together what it means to do God's work in our time.



It is in working together, in caring for one another, in making room at the Inn, that the lonely and frightened spaces within us will be filled with the light of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

We would love for you to come and walk with us this Advent season.

BOOK CLUB DECEMBER 12

On Thursday, December 12, at 7:30 on Zoom, the Book Club will be be reading Jacqueline in Paris, by Ann Mah. This historical novel is a rare and dazzling portrait of Jacqueline Bouvier's college year abroad in postwar Paris, an intimate and electrifying story of love and betrayal, and the coming-of-age of an American icon – before the world knew her as Jackie.

France is a fragile place still haunted by the Occupation. In the aftermath of World War II, Paris has become a nest of spies, and suspicion, deception, and betrayal lurk around every corner. Jacqueline is stunned to watch the rise of communism – never guessing she is witnessing the



beginning of the political environment that will shape the rest of her life—and that of her future husband.

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE



If you haven't visited our First Congregational Church of San Rafael website lately, I encourage you to do so!

The Search committee has updated a number of pages on the website to more accurately reflect who we are now as a congregation. Special thanks to our hard working Search committee members and to Bob Spofford for his technical assistance.

We distributed the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) and got 37 responses. Holy Cow has now begun the data analysis of our CAT submissions. Once completed, the Search committee, Trustees, Council members (other leadership) will hear results via a zoom with the consultants.

Please note the following dates on your calendars for 2025:

January 19 – Church leadership shares results of the analysis with our congregation. We have an in-depth discussion about the results. All are welcome to share your thoughts as we define our profile and define our needs and wants in our next Settled Pastor.

February 2 – Rev Davena Jones with NCNC joins us for worship/discussion following worship for a Day of Discovery. What does the survey tell us about core competencies, and about the scope of work that is a priority for our membership? We need your input and feedback.

February 23 – Congregational Annual Meeting

March 1 – Profile is completed and Settled Pastor position is posted and advertised widely.

Many of you have commented on how blessed we are to have Rev. Elisabeth as our Interim Minister. We are truly grateful for her. She has committed to serve our congregation until we have selected our Settled Pastor. So rest assured, Pastor Elisabeth will continue with us during this transition. We are truly blessed.

STREET CHAPLAINCY DINNER - DECEMBER 3


