Listen

A voice said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

—Luke 9.35

On the first Sunday of March, the lectionary gives us the story of the "Transfiguration." There is such beauty in this story and so many ways in which it prepares us for our time of Lent, which is just around the corner. I encourage you to read the full story in Luke 9:28-36. Steve Garnaas Holmes shares his reflection on these words "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

"The command is not to believe, or even to remember, but to listen.

"In stillness, apart from the screaming news, listen.

"Let your fears and opinions sit quietly in the corner and talk amongst themselves; let them go; ignore them.

"In silence, listen
even if only to the sound
of your own breathing, listen
for the silence
that is God,
the cloud
that is unknowing,
the presence
you can trust without feeling.

"And if nothing comes to you, keep the silence.
Honor the cloud.
Keep listening.

It will be our focus for Lent, to listen, to regroup spiritually, emotionally, and mentally so that we are not swept away by the barrage of information in the world. The chaos that is ensuing and the disruption to people's lives are intentionally created, to spread fear and to immobilize people. Ours the task then to create an even larger space for God's Spirit to keep taking hold of us, in our physical beings, our hearts, our minds and in our day to day lives. Ours the task to listen to a voice greater. Ours the task to care for what is within our reach. It is how we reconstitute our world.

I recently came across the writings of Diana Butler Bass, author and preacher who lists her "10 W's" as a map to cultivate resilience. I am including them here, but also encourage you to create your own list of practices you have already in place or want to try out, to create a larger space in you for God's spirit to dwell, to withstand the storm.

Here is Diana's list:

- 1. Wake Up: Don't stay under the cover
- 2. Welcome the Day: Say "thank you" first thing when you wake.
- 3. Walk: Get fresh air and exercise. Move, be attentive to your world, you can pray or meditate as you go.
- 4. (Be) with Others: Don't isolate yourself.
- 5. Work: Keep doing your work. Do what you love. Focus on your own gifts and calling.
- 6. Write: Have a creative way to work through your fears, losses, or doubts.
- 7. Watch the News (as able): Use the mute button on your remote. Be cautious with sources. You don't need to know everything but being aware of at least some things is important.
- 8. Wide Sight: (a practice to develop) Don't get fixated on the direct threats. Instead, remind yourself to look toward the edges of your field of vision. What's there? What's not immediately obvious? Is there something on the periphery that is helpful, healing, or hopeful?
- 9. Weep: Embrace whatever emotions come up (laugh as well).
- 10. Wonder: (as much as possible) Embrace mystery.

Building problems and Solutions

The Community Room still had a roof leak after the roofing company said they fixed it on Dec 31. They came again last week and tried again. We await the next rain to see how they did.

The preschool experienced water seeping through the walls into the children's bathroom, which is under the choir area in the sanctuary. We have repaired the down-

spout, cleared again the roof drains, and now are engaging landscaper Audel Barajas to install a French Drain to direct the ground water away the wall in heavy storms.

Near the pedestrian gate to Pilgrim Park, the oak tree roots have caused the sidewalk section to rise. Audel will be renting a concrete grinder to make the sidewalk safer.

AARP Tax Assistance is available on Tuesdays in March and April in the Community Room. We also make the sanctuary available for people waiting...or who need to pray for their taxes.

ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

These meeting notes were submitted by Caran Cuneo, Moderator. The Annual Meeting was held on February 23, 2025, and began with an opening prayer by Pastor Elisabeth Middelberg. The complete report is available at the church and was distributed to the 23 voting members present.



Reports were highlighted by the Moderator and Pastor. All chairs of our standing committees emphasized their accomplishments during 2024.

Following the reports from the Board of Ministry, Board of Trustees, and Board of Mission, the congregation also heard from Every Dollar Feeds Kids.

As part of the Board of Mission's report, a motion was made by Lucinda Ray and seconded by David Knopf to approve First Congregation Church of San Rafael joining our Marin faith communities (within the Marin Interfaith Council) to become a Immigrant Accompaniment Congregation. The motion pass unanimously.

Our Pledge Secretary, Val Sherer, presented the written report that totaled \$95,860 in 2025 pledges. Thank you all for your generous financial support.

Our Treasurer, Caryl Hodges then reviewed our 2025 projected annual budget and balance sheet. After a motion made by Louis Frost and seconded by Caran Cuneo to approve the 2025 budget as presented, the motion passed.

Our Moderator thanked the members who have graciously volunteered to serve in 2025 including the Church Council officers (listed below) and members of our Boards and standing committees. All nominations were approved by a vote of the congregation. The meeting was followed by a delicious pot luck lunch.

Thursday, March 27 The Elders group will meet to talk about our good times and memories in their lives.


Flowers for Easter

MARCH BOOK CLUB - THURSDAY, MARCH 20, 7:30 PM



The book we have chosen for our next Book Club meeting is *Washington's Farewell*, by John Avlon. In *Washington's Farewell*, John Avlon offers a stunning portrait of our first president and his battle to save America from self-destruction. Avlon, editor in chief of *The Daily Beast* and author of *Independent Nation*, brings to light Washington's goodbye by elucidating what it meant not only during the early days of the republic, but its lasting effect through the centuries.

Washington's Farewell Address was a prophetic letter he wrote to his fellow citizens and signed from a "parting friend," addressing the forces he feared could destroy our democracy: hyper-partisan-

ship, excessive debt, and foreign wars. In it, Washington called for unity among "citizens by birth or choice," advocated moderation, defended religious pluralism, proposed a foreign policy of independence (not isolation), and proposed that education is essential to democracy. He established the precedent for the peaceful transfer of power.


Avlon's thesis is that there is much to gain from reexamining this 6,000-word adieu. Within this final address, which was never actually spoken but printed in a national newspaper, Washington implores posterity to value moderation, fiscal discipline, and private virtue. Avlon expertly explores the document by examining Washington's shortcomings; he accrued debt in his youth, was not as educated as his contemporaries, and owned slaves. In time, Washington overcame such flaws, some might argue too late. The full text of the speech can be found in the appendix along with further reading.

The book is available at the Marin and Sonoma County libraries.
